## **DEPOSIT INSTRUCTIONS**

For U.S. Law students, a non-refundable registration fee of \$500 is due upon acceptance into the program. A link to make the deposit will be emailed to the email address provided on your application and can be paid via electronic check (checking or savings) or credit card (MasterCard, Visa, American Express, or Discover credit cards, or debit cards with a MasterCard/Visa logo). Note: PayPath/Heartland, an independent third party contractor, accepts payments to the student account and charges a **nonrefundable** service fee based on the amount charged. The service fee is 2.95% (effective 5/1/23) (minimum \$3.00) of the amount charged. This fee is established and charged solely by PayPath/Heartland and not by Hofstra University. The service fee is paid in full to and retained by PayPath/Heartland; the University does not receive any of this fee. The charge for the service fee will appear separately from the payment on your credit card statement.

The deposit is applied to the total amount owed for the program. The balance of the program fee and tuition fee will be billed directly from Hofstra University. Please see terms and conditions for rules on cancellations.

### How may I receive federal financial aid for the cost of study abroad?

**Curação** — If you are already utilizing a Grad PLUS loan you may submit a Grad PLUS increase form to the Law School's Office of Financial Aid, noting that it is for the Curação trip. Your Grad PLUS loan will be increased to the cost of attendance for the trip. Please visit the Office of Financial Aid to discuss further your specific federal financial aid eligibility for this trip.

*Immigration Law & Border Enforcement*- As this trip is part of the Summer term, you must submit your 2025-2026 FAFSA to Hofstra as it is considered a part of the upcoming academic year. Furthermore, per federal regulations to be eligible for federal financial aid you must be enrolled in at least 5 credits for the Summer. You must submit a Summer Loan Request form to the Office of Financial Aid, for your summer financial aid package to be created.

**Pisa** - As this trip is part of the Summer term, you must submit your 2025-2026 FAFSA to Hofstra as it is considered a part of the upcoming academic year. Furthermore, per federal regulations to be eligible for federal financial aid you must be enrolled in at least 5 credits for the Summer. You must submit a Summer Loan Request form to the Office of Financial Aid, for your summer financial aid package to be created.

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

**ELIGIBILITY:** All 2L, 3L, 4L and LL.M. students in good standing are eligible to participate in this program. U.S. Passport required.

#### **RESPONSIBILITY:**

Hofstra Law School offers this Summer program as a sponsoring organization. Any designated tour operator(s), in turn, acts only as an agent for any transportation carrier, hotel, ground operator, or other suppliers of services connected with this program ("other providers"), and the other providers are solely responsible and liable for providing their respective services. Hofstra Law School and its designated tour operator shall not be held liable for (A) any damage to, or loss of, property or injury to, or death of, persons occasioned directly or indirectly by an act or omission of any other provider, including but not limited to any defect in any aircraft, watercraft, or vehicle operated or provided by such other provider; and (B) any loss or damage due to delay, cancellation, or disruption in any manner caused by the laws, regulations, acts or failures to act, demands, orders, or interpositions of any government or any subdivision or agent thereof, or by acts of God, strikes, fire, flood, war, rebellion, terrorism, insurrection, sickness, quarantine, epidemics, theft, or any other cause(s) beyond their control. The participant waives any claim against Hofstra Law School and/or its designated tour operator and tour administrator for any such loss, damage, injury, or death. Hofstra Law School and its designated tour operator reserve the right in their sole discretion to accept, decline to accept, or remove any participant from the program. Baggage and personal effects are at all times the sole responsibility of the participant.

**CLASSES:** All students will be enrolled in a 3 credit course. Attendance in class and at all field trips is required.

ITINERARY CHANGES: The itinerary presented is subject to modification and change by Hofstra Law School or its designated tour operator. Every reasonable effort will be made to operate programs as planned, but alterations may still occur after final itineraries are sent. Any changes to the itinerary will be communicated to participants as soon as reasonably possible.

**HOUSING:** The program will provide housing. All rooms are double occupancy unless otherwise specified. You will be asked to fill out a "Room Selection" form but Hofstra reserves the right to make the final decision of placement in the housing. All other rooms will have students of the same gender.

**INCLUDED IN PROGRAM COST**: 3 credits tuition, accommodations and meals as indicated in the itinerary; specified educational materials; pre-departure information; ground transportation to and from scheduled group events while in San Diego; baggage/accident/medical insurance.

**NOT INCLUDED**: Air transportation to/from San Diego; airport travel expenses; cancellation insurance; personal expenses.

**TERMS AND CONDITIONS:** Students must apply by the specified application date to be considered for the program. Once accepted into the program and having paid the non-refundable \$500 deposit, students will be permitted to move forward with the financial aid process. All 2L, 3L, 4L and LL.M. students in good standing are eligible to participate in this program. The balance of the program fee must be paid by the specified payment date (see Student Financial Services) in order to attend and will be billed directly to you. Accepted students who cancel participation on or before the specified deadline will not be refunded the \$500 deposit. Students who cancel participation after the specified deadline are required to pay the full program balance and tuition, if applicable. If you apply for financial aid but do not receive the aid by the deadline, Hofstra will accept a letter from your school stating that you will receive financial aid for the program. The balance must be paid as soon as you receive your financial aid funds. Hofstra Law School or its designated tour operator reserve the right to increase trip cost or cancel the trip because of inadequate enrollment which makes the trip economically infeasible to operate or because of good-faith concerns with respect to the safety, health, or welfare of the participants. If the trip is canceled prior to departure, you will be provided with a full refund of monies paid. We will not be responsible for any refund for associated trip costs including, but not limited to, nonrefundable airline tickets or for any airline tickets purchased by the passenger directly from an airline or travel agent.
