FIRST ASSIGNMENT Chapter 1 - Introduction to International Arbitration

1. BORN 1-87 (skim only)

As the author of the casebook has explained, Chapter 1 of the casebook differs from the other chapters in the book - in that it contains no excerpts or materials, and is instead a descriptive overview of the history and legal framework for international arbitration, and international commercial arbitration in particular.

Lastly, I will do all the talking this class and give a presentation so do not stress too much about this. In addition, I promise the weekly reading assignments will never be a burden to you. I tested my syllabus out last semester, consulted with the students, and tweaked it to make each reading assignment completely manageable.
